Mission: We provide a transformational environment to homeless men through comprehensive life skills training and counseling that empowers their pursuit of self-sufficiency and independent living.

Homelessness is not hopelessness! Disability is not inability!

Requirements: We are a referral only emergency shelter. Men must be 35 years or older; have taken COVID (24-48 hours) and TB (6 months) tests with negative results; not receive income that exceeds \$1200 per month; and not have any sexual offenses in their background. Referrals are through partner agencies, including the Veteran’s Administration. If a Veteran, you do not need to get your referral through the VA.
